
Dr. Deepak Maheshwari briefed the biodata of Prof. Manish K. Verma and invited him to deliver his speech on Population Explosion, The Trajectory of Sustainable Development and Sustainable Development Goals (SDGS)

Prof. Manish K. Verma described the United Nations Sustainable Development Goals. These goals are 17 targets, we must meet by 2030 to ensure decent lives for all on a healthy planet. He told that the more people there are, the more we take from nature. More land for housing, infrastructure and producing food, more water, more trees. More of us means more pollution and the climate emissions that threaten us all. Our numbers are driving a sixth mass extinction, with 1 million species at risk of disappearing for good. Everyone deserves a long healthy life, but when governments are poor, health systems buckle under the pressure of growing populations. Meanwhile women and children are dying because of barriers to family planning and millions of women and girls still have no say over what happens to their bodies and lives. There is enough of everything for everyone on our planet now if the richest nations take less and share more but with our population expected to reach almost 11 billion by the end of the century, abolishing poverty and hunger and providing food, safe water and energy for all without destroying more of the living world will become impossible. Just as all these problems are linked, so are the solutions. When women and communities are empowered and given the best education, they usually choose smaller families. That helps people escape poverty while taking pressure off resources and the environment. Good health care and economic security free people from the need to have many children to support them and access to modern contraception means that they can choose to have fewer. In rich countries where our impact is so excessively high, we can make a critical difference by having smaller families alongside reducing our runaway consumption.


Dr. Ashok Soni introduced Prof. Satya Paul and invited him to deliver his speech on Population Explosion: Causes and Challenges.




Dr. Monika Dave introduced Benson Agaya and invited him to deliver his speech on Population Dynamics and Sustainable Development in Kenya: A Socio-Economic Systems Analysis.



Benson Agaya revealed that the population size, composition and distribution are among the key aspects of demographic phenomena that have important influence on socio-economic relations and development in any society. For example, gradual increases in population do contribute positively to development by expanding the demand for goods and services and the human resource base that drives development innovations. However, the converse of this is a rapid growth in population that leads to a rapid depletion of natural resources on which livelihoods and development are so highly dependent. In his speech he vividly depicted the shifts in demographic parameters in the Kenyan context and how these affect development and sustainability in the country.

Dr. Anju Beniwal introduced Javeed Ahmad and invited him to deliver his speech on Changing Population Trend: Issues Underlying the Sustainable Global Development. Javeed Ahmed focused on Family Planning Programmes in his speech. He advocated that by controlling the population we can achieve the goals of sustainable development. He highlighted the importance of family planning programmes in controlling the rapid population growth. He also emphasized the need of quality education in controlling the population growth.



All sessions were interactive and speakers answered the questions of participants. The webinar lasted for 3 hours.
