FEEDBACK REPORT- STUDENTS

SESSION 2016-17

The feedback survey on students was conducted by the Internal Quality Assurance Cell of Meera Girls College, Udaipur in February 2017. The feedback focused on the following areas:

- 1. Lecturing Methodology
- 2. Lecturer attributes
- 3. Strengths and weaknesses of the institution.
- 4. Student-teacher relationship
- 5. Student participation in various activities
- 6 Awareness about NAAC

The following were outcomes of the survey:

- 28% of the students found the curriculum 'simple' and easy while 62% rated it 'average' 48% of the respondents stated that 85-100% of courses was completed, 45% of the students stated that 70-85% of the courses were completed, 14% of respondents stated that 55-70% of the courses were completed while a meagre 3% of the respondents felt that less than 55% of the courses were completed.
- Nearly 52% of the teachers come prepared for the lectures while 48% do satisfactory preparations. Students feel that 50% of the teachers are effective in delivering lectures; 30% are very effective while 10% have satisfactory communication skills. 30% of the teachers were rated as intelligent and good communicators by the respondents, 23% of teachers are average communicators, 35% of teachers are polite, kind and friendly.
- 85% of the students feel that the teachers behave very well with them, 8% feel they are strict, while 7% feel that their teachers are indifferent towards them.
- Regarding the choice of subjects, 51% of the students opted for the subjects because of their interest and past performance in the subject and 20% of them made the choice due to the potential help in procuring a job. The remaining 29% of the students made the choice on the recommendation of parents and teachers.
- 88% of the students are fully satisfied with the availability of equipment in the laboratories and only 12 % of them are satisfied to limited extent only.
- 60% of the respondents feel at par with student of other reputed institutions, 25% feel better and higher while 15% of the respondents were not sure. 81% of the students feel proud of the institution.
- 63% of hostel occupants were satisfied with the hostel facility and 37% of respondents were not so satisfied.

- The students feel that the medical facilities in the college are satisfactory according to 61% of the respondents, 28% feel that the facilities are very good while 6% feel they are not adequate and 5% feel that the facilities are not good.
- About 67% of the students want an improvement in library facilities, 31% feel the need for the construction of more classrooms, 10% feel sports facilities are not enough and 14% are not satisfied with the canteen facilities.
- 74% of the students believe that the students union is the true representative body for students, 22% believe that the representation is only to a certain extent and the remaining 4% feel that the representation is negligible.
- 19% of the respondents participate in the seminars and discussions in the college, 23% in cultural activities, 5% in sports, 4% in NCC, 3% in NSS and political activities.
- 52% of the student respondents are aware about NAAC and 95% are informed that the college has received A-Grade.

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FEEDBACK REPORT- PARENTS

SESSION 2016-17

The Internal Quality Assurance Cell of Government Meera Girls College, Udalpur conducted a feedback survey and collected data from parents of regular students for the session 2016-17 in February 2017. A questionnaire consisting of 9 closed-ended and one open-ended question was used for data collection.

- Academic Activities: The most satisfying response is related to the performance of the institution in academic activities. 97% of the parents surveyed are fully satisfied with the teaching activity in the college (response to question no.1 which indicates the satisfaction level of the parents with respect to teaching in the college). They also believe that the college is empathetic to the requirement of students in studies and takes appropriate measures to facilitate an environment conducive for studies that helps in building a bright future of the students (89% of the responses are affirmative to the proposition "Is the College sensitive towards the studies and future of girl students?"; question no.2)
- Environment: Parents feel that the College provides a safe and secure environment for girl students.
 98% of the responses to question no 6 indicate that the college environment is safe for girl students.
- Co-curricular and Extra-curricular Activities: Parents have expressed their satisfaction with the various activities organized and conducted in the college. They believe that the various activities conducted are helpful in the overall development of personality of the girl students (93% affirmative responses recorded for the proposition "Whether the activities in the college are helpful in overall development of girl students?"; question no. 9)
- Student- teacher interaction: Parents are also appreciative of the efforts made by the teachers in solving various problems faced by their wards. 81% of positive responses to the proposition "Whether teachers are helpful in resolving problems faced by students" (question no. 7) indicate the helpful nature of teachers.
- Parents of students from the Arts faculty seem to be dissatisfied with the time-table of the college. They feel that their wards spend longer hours in the college stretching over 8 hours. About 95% of the respondents are dissatisfied as indicated in their response to question no. 3 which asks "Whether you are satisfied with the time-table of the college?" The suggestions given by most

parents is a request to the college administration to make the timetable more compact; as registered in response to invited suggestions in question no.10.

 While responding to question no. 8, 68% parents opine that the students are not utilizing the available sports facilities.

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FEEDBACK REPORT- MEERA ALUMNAE

SESSION 2016-17

The Internal Quality Assurance Cell of Government Meera Girls College, Udaipur conducted a feedback survey and collected data from "Meera Alumnae" association members for the session 2016-17 in February 2017. The feedback can be summarized as under:

- The alumnae respondents in the survey are very satisfied with the activities organized and conducted in the college and agree that these activities are intended and helpful in the overall development of the girl students. 78% of the respondents have rated the activities as 'very good' while 22% as 'good' in response to question no.8; "Do you consider the activities conducted bring about overall development of girls?" Among the most memorable moments of their college life, 95% of those surveyed recollect to state that their participation in cultural and literary activities in response to question .15; "what were the most memorable moments of your college life?
- 100% affirmative responses to question no.7 which asks "whether you feel proud of being an exstudent of Meera Girls College?" indicate that they rank the college at par with top-ranking educational institutions. They also feel that the college administration is sensitive towards problems of students with the intent of resolving issues; 85% positive responses to question .10. "Whether the college has taken care of their problems as students and ex-students?"
- The alumnae association is active and is willing to contribute for the development of the institution.
- According to the respondents, the laboratory facilities in the college are good and 93% of them
 feel that the laboratories are well-equipped. Likewise, according to 88% of the respondents, the
 library facilities are also good. About 98% of the respondents feel that the hostel facility is good
 but the computer facilities are not so good. About 63% of the respondents have rated the
 computer facilities as 'average'.
- They feel that their education in the college has proved helpful in their career pursuits (92% of the respondents hold this opinion in their response to question.12) and that college education has strengthened their moral values (as recorded in their response to question.no. 13)

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ACTION TAKEN REPORT

SESSION 2016-17

In response to the feedback received from different stakeholders including students through the feedback collected by the Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC), the following measures have been taken:

- The 'Fish-Bowl" technique as a new teaching method was introduced and demonstrated to the teaching faculty with a view to make the teaching-learning process more interesting for the students.
- 2. For spreading awareness about the use of novel means of cashless transactions, a workshop on 'Mobility to Cashless Transactions' was organized. Another workshop on "Physical Fitness and Well-being" was organized to motivate the teachers to maintain good level of fitness.
- 3. Various gender sensitization activities including a workshop on "Beti-Bachao-Beti Padhao" and the PCPNDT Act was organized for the students.
- 4. With the efforts of the Youth Development Centre (YDC) of the college, sponsored scholarship for meritorious students was arranged from Mahindra Finance.
- 5. With the efforts of Director, Physical education, Meera Girls College, Udaipur, a grant of ₹ 13 lakhs was received from the Ministry of Tribal Affairs, Government of India for "WAMASHAKSHAM"- training for "SELF-DEFENCE AND PERSONALITY DEVELOPMENT OF ST GIRLS" of the college. Girl students from general category were also beneficiaries of this programme.
- 6. Administrative sanction from the MP-LAD fund worth ₹ 10 lakhs was received for the repair and renovation work of the hostel premises within the college campus by the efforts of the college administration.
